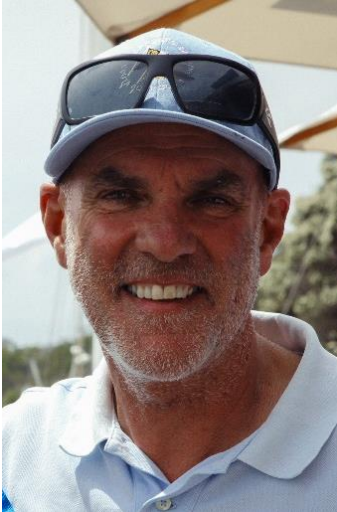

SUSIE DI PIERDOMENICO



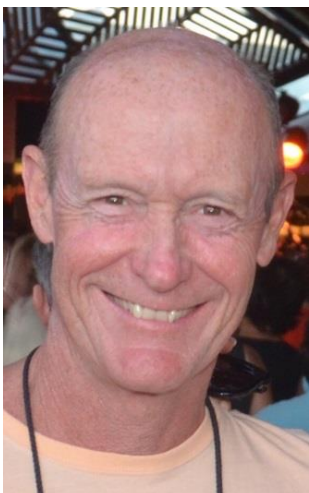
