Procedural matters

- 1. The protest committee was introduced and there were no objections on the grounds of conflict of interest.
- 2. The protest committee declared a minor conflict of interest as employees of the SSCBC which the protest committee had decided was insignificant.
- 3. The jury had considered a report and the possibility of a rule 69 hearing and decided that the matter should be heard consistently with 11.4 of <u>World Sailing Guidance on</u> <u>Misconduct.</u>

Facts Found

The incident

- 1. 1232 and 789 were rounding a mark.
- 2. 1232 hailed, claiming to have mark-room but was not given
- 3. There were other boats in the vicinity of the mark.
- 4. 1232 swore abusively at 789 including the 'F' word.

Conclusions

- 1. 1232's swearing broke RRS 2, Fair Sailing.
- 2. By knowingly breaking a rule and not taking the appropriate penalty, which was to retire, 1232 failed to compete in compliance with the principles of sportsmanship and fair play, and broke RRS 2.

Decision

1232 is disqualified and is to be scored DNE, Disqualification that is not excludable.
